I. Background

The Prespa/Ohrid Euroregion Council is the steering body of the Prespa/Ohrid Euroregion. It consists of fifteen members and equally represents each border community (of Albania, Greece and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia) participating in the Prespa/Ohrid Euroregion. Each side is represented by five members from associations of local and regional authorities, development agencies and (in one case) chambers of commerce consisting on each side of the borders.

The Euroregion Council meeting on 01 June 2005 was the first gathering in a series of meetings and trainings aimed at elaborating representative and relevant development priorities for the Prespa/Ohrid region. The Council Meeting on 01 June 2005 was followed by a training workshop for local authority administrative staff on strategic planning and workplan elaboration on 08 June 2005 in Ohrid and a second council meeting from 15 – 16 June 2005 on the elaboration of a comprehensive list of development priorities for Prespa/Ohrid based on the suggestions elaborated during the first Council Meeting. Involved in the elaboration of the Euroregion development priorities were next to the council members (mayors, prefects, experts) also administrative experts from the Prespa/Ohrid local and regional authorities and representatives of various Prespa/Ohrid Euroregion working groups (Higher Education, NGO Network, Tourism).

II. General Conclusions

The Council meeting started with welcoming words from Mr. Kalatziaias and Mr. Blagas from the Prefecture of Florina as well as Mr. Busse from the EastWest Institute. Opening statements were made by Mr. Simanopoulos from Center for Inter Balkan Cooperation Kozani, Mr. Grabocka from the Regional Development Agency of Korca and Mr. Taleski, the Mayor of Bitola. The three sides explained their regional development priorities as agreed upon internally by Euroregion members on each side of the border. It became clear that there was a substantial overlap of development goals as needs are similar on each side of the borders and Euroregion associations based their priority list upon common recommendations made in 2003 by the Prespa/Ohrid Economic Task Force in its



publication "". Subsequently the participants discussed to what extent it was necessary to go beyond the development recommendations set out in the study "".

It was concluded that additional develop-ment goals were necessary as there was not enough input from smaller prefectures and municipalities in the study. Priority areas were defined as:

- Road Infrastructure between all prefectures and municipalities
- Support to Small and Medium Sized Enterprises in the Region
- Cooperation and Improvement on Health Infrastructure
- Joint Environmental Protection Initiatives
- Tourism Development
- Higher Education Co-operation

A comprehensive list of the development priorities as endorsed by the participants can be found in the Annex to this report. The council members further agreed to have administrative experts from each member municipality and prefecture elaborate the development priorities further.
